### Binghamton's Patterson CAA Wrestler of Week Binghamton's Schiedel Rookie of Week

LAWRENCEVILLE, NJ—Josh Patterson of Binghamton University is the Colonial Athletic Association Wrestler of the Week, while teammate Nate Schiedel is the CAA Rookie of the Week, for all completion the first week of March.

Patterson, a senior 174 from Ontario, NY (Wayne Central, won his weight class at the CAA Championships with two pins and a major decision. In the finals he defeated the top seed 16-6 for the title and was named the CAA Championships' Most Outstanding Wrestler.

Schiedel, a freshman 184 from Caledonia, NY (Caledonia Mumford), won his weight class at the CAAs, winning all three of his bouts. He won by fall in the quarterfinals, defeated the fourth seed in the semifinals and defeated the second seed in the finals.

Both wrestlers are heading to Omaha, Nebraska for the NCAA Championships March 18-20.

### Binghamton Wins 2010 CAA Wrestling Championship

LAWRENCEVILLE, NJ—With four champions, one runner-up, one third place and fourth place finisher, Binghamton University has won the 2010 Colonial Athletic Association Championship, hosted by Rider University. Binghamton had never finished higher than fourth place in a conference wrestling championship.

Old Dominion, ranked 23<sup>rd</sup> in the nation, placed runner-up with three champions, a second, a third and a fourth. Host Rider finished third with two champions and four third place finishers.
